

Wedding Reception Planning Tips

Every couple wants their reception to be special and unique. The memories will last a lifetime for you and your guests. Here are a few ideas to help the reception go smoothly.

Try to start the reception no more than one hour after the ceremony, with dinner served one hour after it begins. Remember, most of your guests have no other place to go after the ceremony. Don't make them wait too long.

Upon arrival at the reception, work closely with the DJ to get the introductions organized and underway. If you plan on having your receiving line at the reception, it should begin immediately after the wedding party arrives.

Cutting the cake directly after dinner saves time! Most caterers, photographers and DJs prefer to cut the cake immediately after the bride and groom finish dinner. This is primarily so it can be cut while most of your guests are finishing their main course. Waiting to cut the cake until after everyone has finished dinner usually extends the dinner portion of the evening and may cut into your dance music time.

If there will be more than one toast, the best man should be first. Other toasts or a thank you from the bride and groom or parents should be short and to the point. Remember, dinner is getting cold.

Schedule the first dance, wedding party dance, bouquet and garter toss, bride & father dance and dollar dance immediately after dinner. This allows those who must leave early the opportunity to "see everything". Older persons who might not want to stay for the dance music can leave if they wish without missing out.

Select music with your guests in mind first! Your personal taste is important but remember, you asked your family and friends to join you for a party. Don't eliminate any styles of music they might want to hear. Music should be danceable either fast or slow and should be recognizable to a large portion of your guests.

Be sure to visit with as many people as you can... The night will be over before you know it and you don't want to leave anyone out. Your closest friends and relatives will follow you around most of the night. If you hang out at the bar, so will they. If you wander out to the lobby, they'll follow you. Even if you personally don't like to dance, it's best to stay near the dance floor or at least in the same room as the entertainment. Chances are more people will get interested in dancing if they are near the music.

Try to stay to the end of the reception. If you must leave, be sure to leave someone in charge. This person should have the authority to extend the entertainment or deal with any other situations that may arise.

Wedding Planning Timeline

Now that you're engaged, sit back, take a deep breath and remember that wedding planning should be a fun and enjoyable experience. The next six months to a year will be exciting, hectic, and full of surprises, but hopefully not too stressful. The following planning timetable can be used as a guideline to give you a quick idea of what to do and when. Keep in mind, early planning never hurts.

Reception Introductions and Grand Entrance

Introductions can be performed by Starz Entertainment or by someone else. *(Requests to change this at the reception will only be honored if given directly by the Bride or Groom to the DJ.)* Who will be performing the introductions?

Suggested order of introductions: *We normally do not formally introduce parents and grandparents during the grand entrance, but do acknowledge them later in the evening. They can be introduced with the rest of the wedding party if desired!*

1. Bridesmaids & Groomsmen
2. Maid/Matron of Honor (Can be combined with best man)
3. Best Man (Can be combined with maid/matron of honor)
4. Bride & Groom

The Bride and Groom's First Dance:

We like to do the first dance immediately when the bride and groom enter after the grand entrance. This gives the catering staff a chance to finish pouring champagne for toasts and knocks out one event while you are already standing in the middle of the dance floor. If you want to do toasts immediately following, the bride and groom are already in front of everyone so the toast can be addressed to them.

Your selection of Music for the first dance (*slow song recommended*):

If you do your 1st dance after dinner, you can have us invite your guests to join in partway through the above song, or we can invite them up when the next song begins. We can have the wedding party join you first and invite the rest of the guests to join in one verse later, or we can invite all of the guests (including wedding party) to join in at the same time. When and how do you want us to invite other guests to join in?
